Jon Cline has 28 years of experience in education and career college operations. As vice president since 2008 and director of training and industry since 1997, Cline is focused on legislative and regulatory issues, marketing, admissions, education management, industry relations and customized specialty training projects for The Refrigeration School, Inc.
